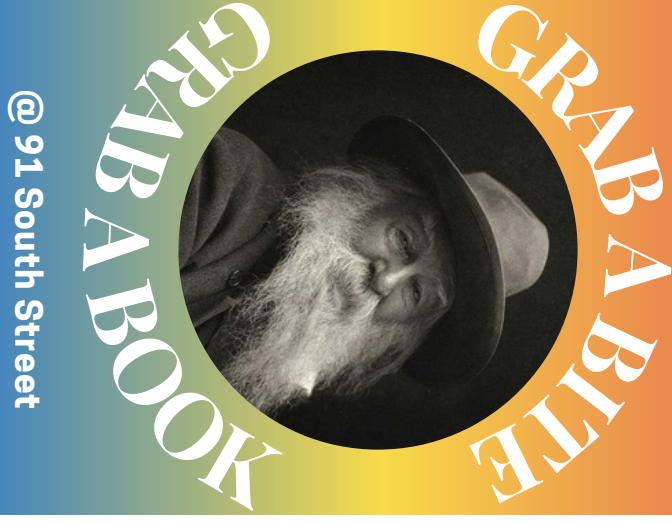


“A Farm Picture”
